Each year in October Kokua Council invites a number of community leaders to speak about issues that are of importance to them in a forum setting. At the end of the session, those in attendance submit their views of what legislative priorities should be in the coming session.

This year's presenters are listed at the right.

Kokua Council's board goes through the priorities submitted to us during the next two months. Then we assign leaders to the top issues and make preliminary decisions on what issues will be supported with written or oral testimony in the 2017 session.
